Footsteps is designed for everyone who wants to deepen their faith and to develop their understanding and skills as they serve God in local churches and communities.

Footsteps 1 is a one year course which has now been running for 6 years in CBA. **Footsteps 2** is the 2nd year of the course for those who wish to continue. **Footsteps Pathway Days** are held once each term; they are open to everyone and focus on one aspect of Christian life and ministry.

Footsteps is a partnership between Regent's Park College, Oxford and the Central Baptist Association and the Southern Counties Baptist Association.

In CBA Footsteps 1 and 2 has been meeting at the Church of Christ the King, Frithwood Crescent, Kents Hill, Buckinghamshire, MK7 6HG

Each Saturday, there are five interactive sessions, opportunities for worship and prayer all together and in small groups, as well as informal times to chat over coffee breaks and lunch.

Are there any previous requirements?

Footsteps is open to everyone, whatever you have studied or not studied in the past. But we ask that you have the support of your local church.

What does is cost?

For 2018-19 the cost is £330. We encourage your church to pay 2/3rds. There may also be some assistance available from the CBA through training grants.







What will we study in Footsteps 1?

There are 9 teaching streams which run through the year.

5 are core subjects that everyone studies together:

- Understanding the Bible
- Understanding our Faith
- · Deepening Spirituality
- Mission, Evangelism and Culture
- Baptist History and Principles

4 are option subjects from which students choose TWO:

- Pastoral Care or Exploring Worship
- Leadership Skills or Preaching Skills

What can I expect?

- Interactive participation in sessions.
- Some preparation, on occasions, between Saturdays.
- The opportunity to keep a journal during the year.
- The **option** of writing some assignments.
- Challenge and inspiration from the sessions and from the prayerful support of leaders and fellow participants.

What will I receive?

A growing understanding of ministry and mission as you explore faith in the context of a supportive group. [There is also a final Reunion evening at which certificates are presented!]

Lay Training recognised by CBA and 'Baptists Together':

For anyone who is seeking to be recognised formally as a Lay Leader, Footsteps 1 and 2, with all assignments successfully completed, fulfil the *academic* requirement.
