A course for everyone living out their faith in local churches and communities



Footsteps is designed for everyone who wants to deepen their faith and to develop their understanding and skills as they serve God in local churches and communities.

Footsteps 1 is a one year course which has now been running for 11 years. Footsteps 2 is the 2nd year of the course for those who wish to continue. Footsteps Pathway Days are held once each term; they are open to anyone and focus on one aspect of Christian life and ministry.

Footsteps is a partnership between Regent's Park College, Oxford and the Southern Counties Baptist Association and the Central Baptist Association. The Children, Youth and Families option, introduced last year and supported by the Centre for Family and Childhood Studies, Bristol Baptist College, will run again this year.

Dates for 2018-19:

Footsteps 1 and 2 will held on the following 10 Saturdays, September to June, from 10 a.m. to 4.15 p.m.

13th October 16th March
17th November 27th April
8th December 11th May
12th January 15th June

Venue: SCBA Footsteps 1 and 2 meet at The Baptist Church in Thatcham.

Each Saturday, there are five interactive sessions, opportunities for worship and prayer all together and in small groups, as well as informal times to chat over coffee breaks and lunch.

Are there any previous requirements?

Footsteps is open to everyone, whatever you have studied or not studied in the past. But we ask that you have the support of your local church.

What does is cost?

For 2018-19 the cost is £330. We encourage your church to pay 2/3rds. There may also be some assistance available from the SCBA through training grants.







Studying in Footsteps 1:

There are 10 teaching streams which run through the year.

5 are core subjects that everyone studies together:

- Understanding the Bible
- Understanding our Faith
- Deepening Spirituality
- Mission, Evangelism and Culture
- Baptist History and Principles

5 are option subjects from which students either choose TWO:

- Pastoral Care or Exploring Worship
- Leadership Skills or Preaching Skills

or just ONE, for those taking the 'double' option

Children, Youth and Families

What can I expect?

- Interactive participation in sessions.
- Some preparation, on occasions, between Saturdays.
- The opportunity to keep a journal during the year.
- The **option** of writing some assignments.
- Challenge and inspiration from the sessions and from the prayerful support of leaders and fellow participants.

What will I receive?

A growing understanding of ministry and mission as you explore faith in the context of a supportive group. There is also a final Reunion evening at which certificates are presented.
