Are you a Pioneer?





The Baptist Colleges have always been involved in pioneering – both in preparing those who will serve in a whole variety of new mission contexts and in developing new patterns of training and formation.

Regent's Park College has developed a new pathway for those called to be Baptist pioneers, which leads to being an accredited Baptist minister. This pathway is a partnership between Regent's Park College and CMS Pioneer Mission Leadership Training, which is also based in Oxford.

The course has been designed by pioneers for pioneers and will enable you to journey with a whole range of other people both those who will be pioneering in many different contexts and those who will also be preparing to be Baptist ministers.

This one integrated course will involve:

- Academic study through CMS which would lead to either a Diploma, BA or MA in Theology, Ministry and Mission.
- Formation for Baptist Ministry through Regent's Park College, Oxford
- A placement in a pioneering church context, which would be up to a half-time role

Pattern of study:

The course is normally 3 years in length. It will involve:

- One day a week study in Oxford
- Four block weeks a year (totalling 14 days) in Oxford
- Three reflection days a year arranged more locally

Course Content

You will study a variety of modules that will give you a deeper engagement with the Bible, and greater understanding of theology and Baptist life, all of which will integrated into practice. These will include:

- Mission and Evangelism
- Spirituality and Discipleship
- Bible in Context
- Mission Ecclesiology
- Developing Ministry and Worship in Context
- Leadership
- Sexuality and Relationships
- Exploring Justice
- Mission as Dialogue
- Baptist History and Principles
