

Workshop on the five habits of CMD

In October 2020, Baptists Together launched a CMD Handbook setting out expectations of recognised Baptist ministers for their continuing ministerial development (CMD). The approach centres on five habits of CMD which ministers are asked to adapt to their own needs and contexts. This workshop supports ministers in that process of adapting the five habits.

Learning objectives

- To give ministers an opportunity to discuss the CMD Handbook launched in October with other ministers.
- To enable ministers to undertake and discuss preliminary reflections on their current engagement with the five habits of CMD.
- To enable ministers to identify areas where they would like to explore further opportunities.
- To enable ministers to start work on a plan that will lead them to their first review meeting in Autumn 2021
